Maths-Place value

This term the children will be looking at number and place value. Children will be taught to recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number. (Hundreds, tens and ones). In addition, this term, they will be looking at statistics; bar charts, pictograms and tables as well as geometry (2-D shapes).



English

This term the children will be using a core text as a stimulus for writing. The texts 'The king who banned the dark' will be shared through our class reading sessions, building on children's reading skills of inference, clarification, and retrieval. The book will also be used as a stimulus for writing a traditional tales with dilemmas and letters. We would also focus on some grammar skills which includes; expanded noun phrases, coordinating conjunctions, adverbs of time and a range of year 3 punctuation.

PHSE: Being me in my world



In this unit children will be looking at the following:

-Family roles and responsibilities,

Friendship and negotiation,

-Keeping safe online and who to go to for help,

-Being a global citizen,

-Being aware of how my choices affect others, awareness of how other children have different lives,

-Expressing appreciation for family and friends

Science: Light



In this unit the children will recognise that they need light to see things and that darkness is the absence of light.

They will learn that shadows are formed when light from a light source is blocked by a solid object.

Computing



Children will develop their understanding of digital devices, with an initial focus on inputs, processes, and outputs. They also compare digital and non-digital devices. They will be introduced to computer networks, including devices that make up a network's infrastructure, such as wireless access points and switches.

PE:

Gymnastics- This term for indoor PE, children will show an imaginative response to the stimulus of 'space'



They will incorporate different qualities and dynamics into their movement, Exploring and developing new actions while working with a partner.

Invasion games-Tag Rugby-This term for outdoor PE, children will begin to learn how to move a ball, passing and receiving to keep possession of the ball. Pupils will understand the purpose of tagging and develop their understanding of when, where and why they need to create space when they are attacking.

Art: Printing: Ranbir Kaur

In art, children will draw inspiration from an artist, enabling them to make thoughtful decisions about colour and printing. (Tie and dye techniques).



Music

In music, year 3 will learn songs exploring the theme of 'light'.



They will also explore traditional instruments, sing as an ensemble, and perform a tuned percussion part. In addition, they will compare two compositions on a similar theme.

RE: Sanatani Dharma

Children will be learning about different deities and what they tell Sanatanis about God. They will also learn about positive aspects of their personality that might be of help to others.



Spanish

The children will be starting their Spanish learning adventure by exchanging greetings, giving their name, counting to 10 and saying their age.
