

English:

In English, children will be reading How to Train your Dragon by Cressida Cowell. The children will be using this text during their daily reading

sessions as well as using this as a stimulus for writing. The writing genres that the children will be focussing on this term will be: poetry (vocabulary generation and developing a poem), fiction (journey story) and fact files

Science: Living things & their habitats: classification, environmental changes

In science, children will explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment. They will recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things. They




