Physical Development

Children will be learning good practices regarding staying healthy such as eating nutritious foods, getting enough sleep, brushing teeth, and staying active.

In P.E children will be learning how to control their body movements and move in different ways whilst negotiating space and avoiding obstacles. They will focus on building their agility, balance and coordination. Children will create movements and balances in big and small ways on the floor and on apparatus.



Literacv

This term our focus text will be 'Elmer', 'Owl Babies' and 'The colour monster'. The children will be learning new vocabulary from the texts whilst exploring story language such as 'once upon a time' and 'in the end'. They will also have the change to sequence the story, building an understanding of story structures. This term we will start phonic lessons, where we will be learning set, one sounds in our phonics programme RWI.







Maths

The children will be focusing on developing their oral counting skills as well as learning to count with one-toone correspondence, touching each item whilst saying the number names and developing an understanding that the last number counted is the total.
